

Scholarships and Bursaries 2021

Bunbury Catholic College is a well-established and highly regarded co-educational secondary College, serving the needs of the families in the greater Bunbury area. The College is founded on Marist traditions, with prominence given to the values of the Mercy sisters, as part of our rich history.

The College has a long tradition of providing quality teaching and learning, in an environment enlivened by Christ's spirt of love, justice and freedom. It is well resourced, with contemporary facilities, to facilitate and enhance the learning of our students, even as we strive to instil a culture of personal excellence, based upon Gospel values.

Bunbury Catholic College is committed to providing accessible quality education to all students. As a result, we provide a number of scholarships and bursaries each year, to ensure that every family is able to attend our College, regardless of religious denomination or financial constraints. The scholarships are available to any currently enrolled students or those students who would appreciate the opportunity to study at our College.

Scholarship and Bursary Conditions

- Scholarships and bursaries are awarded on the basis of academic aptitude or the ability to demonstrate a commitment to the values of the College.
- Applicants are required to complete the scholarship application package by the due date.
- Students are able to apply for any number of scholarships and bursaries in one application.
- The Principal will evaluate all applications and award scholarships and bursaries dependent upon the applications received.
- The College reserves the right not to award any or all of the scholarships and bursaries available.
- The cost of uniforms, books and any retreats or camps is not included in the scholarship or bursary.
- Scholarship and bursary holders are expected to demonstrate a visible commitment to the ethos of the College.
- Scholarships and bursaries are subject to an annual review of student performance and commitment.
- The Principal will formally notify all families of the outcome of the applications.

- Attach a copy of your 2019 School Report.
- Attach a copy of your latest School Report.
- Attach a copy of your latest NAPLAN report.
- Attach copies of any relevant documents which you feel may support your application (optional).
- Provide the name and contact details of one personal referee from your school or parish.
- Applications must be emailed to admin@bccwa.wa.edu.au, by the due date.
- No late applications will be accepted.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES AVAILABLE FOR 2021

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

A Scholarship is an award of financial assistance to enable a student to further his/her education. The Academic Scholarships at Bunbury Catholic College are awarded based on set academic criteria.

The Senior Academic Scholarships are available for students enrolling in Year 11 at Bunbury Catholic College (2021). Each Academic Scholarship covers a generous proportion of the tuition fees at the College and is awarded for Year 11 and for Year 12.

Applications are invited from both students who are currently enrolled at the College and those who may wish to further their studies at the College.

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of Bunbury Catholic College.

STEM SCHOLARSHIPS

A STEM Scholarship is an award of financial assistance to enable a student to further his/her education in the area of STEM.

The STEM Scholarships will be awarded to students who show particular interest and ability in this area, and who intend to pursue these subjects in both Year 11 and Year 12.

The STEM Scholarship will cover a generous proportion of the tuition fees at the College and is awarded for both Year 11 and Year 12.

Applications are invited from students enrolling in Year 11 (2021), who are either currently enrolled at the College or who may wish to further their studies at the College.

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of Bunbury Catholic College.

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND TRAINING SCHOLARSHIPS (VET)

A VET Scholarship is an award of financial assistance to enable a student to further his/her education in the VET Pathway.

The VET Scholarships will be awarded to students who show particular ability in this area and who intend studying two or more certificate courses over both Year 11 and Year 12.

A Personal Portfolio of work may form part of the application, in addition to the general application. This Portfolio may include documents/evidence to support aspects such as

- Work Experience/Work Exposure
- Evidence of personal projects undertaken
- Part-time employment

The VET Scholarships cover a generous proportion of the tuition fees at the College and they are awarded for both Year 11 and Year 12.

Applications are invited from students enrolling in Year 11 (2021), who are either currently enrolled at the College or who may wish to further their studies at the College.

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of Bunbury Catholic College.

ROSE INDIGENOUS BURSARIES

The Rose Indigenous Bursaries are open to students of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent. They cover a substantial proportion of the tuition fees at the College and are renewable each year, subject to a successful annual review.

Students from Year 7 to Year 11 are welcome to apply and are expected to demonstrate commitment and motivation in the areas of learning, leadership and community.

Applications are invited from both currently enrolled students and those who may wish to study at the College. (Students currently receiving support from the Rose Bursary need not reapply.)

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of Bunbury Catholic College.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES AVAILABLE FOR 2021

CATHOLIC SCHOLARSHIPS

The Catholic Scholarship is an award of financial assistance to enable a student to further his/her education at Bunbury Catholic College.

This Scholarship has been established to ensure that all students have the opportunity to benefit from a Catholic education, regardless of a family's capacity to meet the associated costs.

Students from Year 8 to Year 11, who are not currently enrolled in a Catholic school, are to apply for this Scholarship.

This Scholarship covers a substantial proportion of the tuition fees at the College and is renewable each year, subject to a successful annual review.

Applicants are asked to provide a personal reference from his/her Parish Priest, as part of the general application.

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of Bunbury Catholic College.

CROSS VERWIJMEREN PTY LTD INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIPS

Cross Verwijmeren Pty Ltd is a local earthmoving company, specialising in mining and exploration. As part of supporting the local Indigenous community, they are offering generous scholarships for two Indigenous students, who are following either an ATAR or a General/VET pathway. While these scholarships are particularly relevant to students who may wish to pursue a career in mining or a related service industry, students with other career aspirations are also encouraged to apply.

The scholarships, which cover a substantial proportion of the tuition fees at the College, are available to students entering either Year 10 or Year 11 at the College in 2021. They will be renewed each year, until the student graduates, subject to an annual review.

Applications are invited from Indigenous students who are either currently enrolled at the College or those who may wish to further their education at the College.

MADALAH INDIGENOUS SCHOLARSHIPS

MADALAH Limited is a not-for-profit organisation that offers secondary and tertiary education scholarships for Indigenous students from remote and regional communities to Western Australia's leading boarding schools and Australian universities.

Bunbury Catholic College, in partnership with MADALAH Limited, is able to offer scholarships of \$2,500 for a student of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, who studies at the College.

Applications are invited from both currently enrolled students and those who may wish to further their studies at the College, in all years of study.

Current or prospective students must apply via the MADALAH Limited website and be able to provide proof of offer or enrolment at Bunbury Catholic College. MADALAH Website

The number of scholarships awarded is at the discretion of MADALAH Limited.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

The Music Department at Bunbury Catholic College offers several scholarship opportunities for gifted and talented music students.

Scholarship aptitude tests are held on Wednesday 4 November 2020 at 4.00pm sharp.

Students who have not studied music before are most welcome to apply and will be considered.

The scholarship award aims to develop talented students who may have had limited music tuition opportunities. It is a merit-based award, given annually to four students, from Year 7 (2021): one in clarinet, one in trumpet, one in trombone and one in bass guitar.

Applications are invited from students enrolled at Bunbury Catholic College in Year 7 2021.
