2024 MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

The Music Department at Bunbury Catholic College offers several scholarship opportunities for gifted and talented music students. Scholarship aptitude tests are held on Wednesday 25 October at 4.00pm sharp. Students who have not studied music before are most welcome to apply and will be considered, guided by the criteria below. The scholarship award aims to develop talented students who may have had limited music tuition opportunities. It is a merit-based award, given annually to four students entering Year 7 in 2024: one in Saxophone, one in trumpet, one in trombone and one in flute. Only students accepted to attend Bunbury Catholic College are eligible for this scholarship.

Purpose of the Award

The BCC Music Scholarship is intended to strengthen and support the music programs at the College by covering half the music tuition fees and providing an instrument for one year only. The awards are reserved for students entering Year 7 in 2024.

Award Amounts

Students who are granted the Music Scholarship will have half the music tuition fees paid for one year and receive an instrument for the year. Music Scholarship recipients are subject to all of the rules and regulations of the College's Instrumental Music policies including instrument hire agreements. The amount of the Music Scholarship is credited to the student's music fees account on a term-by-term basis.

Criteria

The Music Scholarships are granted with consideration to the following criteria:

- The student's record of experience and/or outcome of music aptitude tests
- The student's academic record
- The potential for the applicant to contribute to the quality of the music program through commitment to an ensemble

Obligations

Students receiving Music Scholarships will be expected to fulfil their academic and artistic responsibilities. These will include consistent attendance to lessons, involvement in one or more school and/or community bands or ensembles and demonstrating exemplary behavior. Students are expected to commit to their Music Scholarship for the school year.

How to Apply

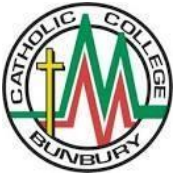
