OUR OLYMPIC ATHLETES!



They will forever be part of Australia's most successful Olympic team – three incredible BCC ex-students competed in this year's Olympic Games in Paris which started on July 26, and another has his time to shine in the pool for the Paralympics.

We are proud to see the outstanding achievements of so many ex-students who have chosen to pursue competition at the highest levels of their chose sports.

Being selected to compete at the Olympic Games is a dream for many athletes, but few reach the position of BMX racer Lauren Reynolds for whom Paris 2024 was her fourth Olympics.

Lauren, from the Class of 2008, has been ranked among Australia's top 10 riders for more than a decade and in Paris this year she attained 10th place in the Women's BMX Racing. Her first Olympics was in London in 2012 - along with classmate and Olympic Rower Alexandra Hagan - and her best Olympic performance was 5th at the 2020 games.

Marathon Swimmer Kyle Lee attended Bunbury Catholic College at the Mercy Campus from 2015 - 2019 and graduated from Our Lady of Mercy in 2020. He was part of the Southwest Academy of Sport and dreamed of one day becoming an Olympian. That dream came true on August 9 when he dived into the Seine and swam the 10km Marathon to finish in 13th place.

Paris was also a first Olympic Games for Hockey player Jake Harvie, Class of 2015, who plays half-back for the Kookaburras. Jake is a gold medallist from the 2018 and 2022 Commonwealth Games and the team held hopes of adding an Olympic gold medal for the first time since 2004. The Kookaburras made it to the quarterfinals before a 2-0 loss to the Netherlands ended their campaign.

Ex-student Alex Saffy, aka the “Bunbury Bullet”, was selected for Australia in the 2024 Paralympics. Alex would have graduated from BCC in 2023 however he left the College in 2022 to pursue his swimming career.

Alex, who was diagnosed with dyskinetic cerebral palsy at age 7, competes on September 3 & 7 contesting the 100m Butterfly and 200m Individual Medley, and he’s a possibility for the 100m Freestyle.

Alex is one of 15 first-time Paralympian athletes named among a team of 30 for the Australian swimming team to compete in Paris. This life-changing selection is a result of his consistent dedication and performance on the national and international stages.

BCC ALUMNI INC - WE'RE RE-BRANDING!

Yes, we're re-branding! We are now officially renamed BCC Alumni Incorporated, updating from BCC Ex Student Association this year, with a new Constitution! *Alumni* is a term used to describe former students or graduates of a school, college, or university. We decided to be part of the global family of graduates by adopting the word 'alumni'

Why? Firstly, it has cultural and historical significance: 'Alumni' has a longstanding tradition in formal academic institutions, particularly in western education. It is a term recognised and used internationally across various languages and cultures.

Secondly, 'alumni' implies a continuing relationship with the institution, often carrying a positive

connotation of pride, loyalty and ongoing affiliation. It emphasises a sense of belonging and the enduring, sometimes lifelong connection between individuals and their graduating school. 'Ex students' on the other hand might sound more detached from the school, less connection.

Who's included? Our Alumni includes those who have attended *Bunbury Catholic College* from 1973 onwards, *Marist Brothers* prior to 1973 and *St Joseph's* prior to 1973. This spans a history of well over 100 years of Catholic Education in Bunbury, and nearly 51 years of Bunbury Catholic College alumni. Some of our St Joseph's and Marist Alumni are celebrating life well into their 80's and 90's. It was wonderful to meet with some of our oldest and youngest Alumni at our 50-year anniversary in 2024.

BIOGRAPHY



TAYLOR BUORO Graduated in 2008: Originally from regional Western Australia, Taylor is a trained screen and stage Actor in addition to her work as an Arts Educator and Filmmaker. Her educational pursuits include a Double Degree in Contemporary Performance (WAAPA/ECU) a Graduate Diploma in Education (Drama/Visual Arts specialisation) and Post Graduate qualifications in Arts Management (Deakin) and Art History/Curatorial studies (ANU).

She is currently completing a Masters in Screenwriting at the Australian Film Television and Radio School (AFTRS). Through AFTRS Taylor has had the opportunity to write and choreograph, *ALLY*, a proof of concept for her science fiction feature film *VESTIGE*. Her exegesis is focused on interdisciplinary collaboration in screenwriting and will culminate in the musical short film *INTERLUDE*. A project she wrote, acted and choreographed for.

In 2022 she worked on Damien Giglietta's (88 to 1 Productions, Six Placed Pictures) latest feature film *MERCY OF OTHERS* as Producer, Production Designer and Acting Coach. In 2021 she acted in her first feature film *MISPLACED* by James Demitri, starring Matt Levett. Her love for filmmaking has also seen her adopt the role of Director, Writer and Producer while acting in the smartphone short film, *PACKET MIX* (2021).

Taylor's acting has seen her work across theatre and screen in Western Australia, New South Wales and London. Taylor is determined to continue developing her craft, promoting arts accessibility for regional areas, and embracing all that this incredible industry has to offer. Taylor still has strong family connections to her home town, Bunbury.
