

Our Programs


We aim to provide as many pathways for our students as possible. This ensures that students are geared up and ready for their career, regardless of whether they're leaning toward university or employment.

A Certificate IV satisfies many university entrance requirements and can provide entry into a lot of non-competitive courses. If students are aiming to get into a competitive course (eg: Nursing) they should have a plan B with the aim of switching after a semester.

Cert II Qualifications / Year 10 Program

In 2025, we surveyed many of our school VET Coordinators to ask how we could help provide options for the Year 10s who are ready to start their career journey early. The feedback was clear - schools needed flexible, supportive programs that would allow Year 10s to explore potential careers while building confidence in their abilities. In response, we've expanded our offerings to include Certificate II options and also introduced semester-based study options at this qualification level. This means Year 10s can now start with just one semester to explore a pathway, or commit to a full program if they're ready. With support from our dedicated Student Support Team and EQ Team, Year 10s can build their skills gradually while working toward nationally recognised qualifications that move them in the direction of their future career choice.

Our Certificate IV qualifications are designed to give Year 12 students a competitive edge - whether they're heading to university or straight into the workforce. These higher-level programs combine advanced practical skills with academic preparation, creating multiple pathways for their future. ALL of our Cert IV qualifications provide our graduating students with the ability to apply to university at the equivalent of a 70 ATAR entry point. Note that not all of our Cert IV programs will provide WACE points for WA students, however if students have already achieved enough WACE points to graduate through their year 11/other subjects - then this wont be a deal breaker.



This upgrade is for students who have completed the Cert IV in Tertiary Preparation (Zoology) who wants to add on the Marine & Environmental Conservation Units to give them a well rounded foundation in all areas before moving onto University, Students will achieve an additional 4 units.
